YMCA's Camp Mohawk, Camp Conoy opening

The Baltimore Area YMCA is opening its two resident camps, Mohawk for boys and girls and Conoy for boys.

A. P. Moss, associate director of the Y announced that Camp Conoy, for boys only, begins the season on Saturday, June 22.

George Landes is the resident director for this camp which is located near Lusby in Calvert County.

Camp Mohawk, also located in Calvert County at Huntingtown, will be under the direction of Edward Clapp.

Mohawk's opening five weeks are for boys only.

Girls will camp there for four weeks beginning July 29.

Kings Landing Park was home of Camp Mohawk, a summer camp for African-American youth that was run by the Baltimore YMCA. The camp offered cabins, campfires, swimming, tennis, canoeing, archery and other outdoor recreation.



Of the original cabins, only seven remain on site; four at Camp Cocktown Creek and three at Camp Mohawk Hill. The integrity of the original architecture is being preserved for historical value. The interior beams have preserved some of the graffiti from original campers.
