Volunteer Program Summary

The COVID-19 pandemic impacted the Calvert Stewards volunteer program an 2020. Beginning in early March, all volunteer programs had to be adapted to comply with the social distancing protocols required by state and local governments. As shown in the accompanying table, some programs were severely impacted while others were able to adjust and proceed almost normally with the new protocols in place. Despite these challenges, total volunteer hours increased from 2,848 in 2019 to 3,662 in 2020.

The two most popular volunteer programs from 2019, education and animal care, suffered the most under the COVID restrictions due to the suspension of in-person learning in local schools and the closure of the Battle Creek Cypress Swamp Nature Center. Large increases were seen in programs that allowed volunteers to work as individuals or family groups including park maintenance and the various research projects. In some cases, for example the Saw-whet Owl Project and Monarch Watch, program managers were able to allow volunteers to work together with social distancing and mask requirements in place.

In 2020, 84 Calvert Stewards contributed 3662 hours with a monetary value of \$108,066. Our top volunteer for 2020 is Jason Avery who contributed 509 hours with a value of \$15,021! Mary Hollinger was a close second with 503 volunteer hours.
