#### Our Mission

The Calvert Stewards volunteer program provides an opportunity for public service in education, research, and stewardship which support the overall missions of the Calvert County Division of Natural Resources and the Calvert Nature Society. This benefits the participants, the parks and the community as Calvert Stewards use and develop their skills to form an environmentally aware community and become the environmental stewards of Calvert County.

We also encourage youth and families to volunteer for projects to create a pipeline of engaged citizens that will continue their involvement in the parks into adulthood.

## **Volunteer Program Summary**

Although still impacted by covid restrictions, our volunteers continued to participate in more volunteer opportunities than ever. Overall, 105 volunteers contributed 4,742 hours in 2021 compared to 3,662 in 2020. The dollar value of our volunteers is equivalent to \$142,037, based on the hourly rate of \$29.95 calculated by the University of Maryland's Do Good Institute and Independent Sector, a national coalition of nonprofits, foundations and corporate giving programs.

Our most popular programs were the bluebird nest box monitoring project, Flag Ponds maintenance, and wildlife rescue, all of which have almost doubled in hours for 2021 compared to 2020.

Flag Ponds Park Ranger Emma McCarthy led a beach clean-up event, along with the help of Park Technician Taylor Quinn. They had several groups pre-register, and even more show up on the day of ready to help. Overall, 79 people participated in the clean-up event. Following the beach clean-up, Taylor Q. led a volunteer planting project; Park Ranger Abby Rieve and Volunteer Park Tech Andrew Miller helped get all of the plants in the ground. - While on break from college, Ben Springer (photo at right) helped with a variety of volunteer projects including documenting barred owl nesting for the Breeding Bird Atlas and assisting with Raptor surveys. He repaired and installed ALL of the Battle Creek nest boxes that were damaged or that washed away in the August 2020 Tropical Storm Isaias.
- A Purple Martin House provided by JoAnna Lutmerding (left hand photo) was installed at Gatewood Preserve. It is installed so the railings and decking can be replaced without the box being removed.

#### Other Projects of Note

Taylor Garner, a participant in the first class of the Calvert County Watershed Stewards program, run through the University of Maryland Extension Sea Grant Program, is working on a project to install rain gardens and interpretive signage at Flag Ponds Nature Park. We have some new teen volunteers that have helped with our bird banding project.

Calvert Steward JoAnna Lutmerding is helping Naturalist Gene Groshon train youth volunteer Scottie Clark with the techniques of banding and processing birds under the MAPS protocols.

The Maryland Conservation Corps crew based out of Merkle NRMA came to Flag Ponds Nature Park four separate days throughout the month to help dig the new trail. Their help was invaluable and allowed us to make a considerable amount of progress on this project.



## **Future Endeavors**

For 2022, we hope to be able to provide more opportunities for our volunteers as COVID-19 becomes less of a threat. we hope to provide more ways to get involved in our education and teaching opportunities as our field trips become in-person. We plan to hold at least one volunteer appreciation event and training day for new volunteers each season.
