# Kayak Leader 2021 Report

Calvert County is uniquely situated between the Patuxent River and the Chesapeake Bay—two great places to paddle! Each season the naturalists lead kayak trips for different groups and programs which are always (weather permitting) a fun way to explore the local aquatic ecosystems up close. Kayak volunteers will work with the naturalist in charge to ensure a safe and enjoyable paddle is had by all. Trips typically launch from and return to Kings Landing Park. Other locations include Lower Marlboro and Nan's Cove.

#### SKILLS NEEDED

- Be flexible there may be unexpected factors or changes to a program; be ready to fill-in or help out where needed
- Fit and able-bodied to handle walking distances while carrying boats, towing a boat with yours, lifting them over your head, boating in adverse conditions, etc.
- Be able to lift and carry kayaks
- Strong canoe/kayak skills
- Strong interpersonal skills to interact positively with the public
- Ability to follow direction

#### Optional, but Preferred, Skills

- Be able to answer questions about Calvert County plants, animals, and ecosystems
- Personal kayak not required, but very helpful
- · First aid and CPR certified
- Ability to properly tie knots to hold canoes/kayaks or willing to learn
- Completion of our kayak leader training and/or a course by the American Canoe Assoc., the American Red Cross or similar organization
- At least 5 years of prior canoe/kayak experience

#### **VOLUNTEER DUTIES**

- Help naturalist(s) unload and load boat trailer
- Regulate foot traffic and parking at the launch site as needed
- Pass out equipment to participants (e.g. PFD's, boats, paddles, glow sticks)
- Help participants carry and launch their boats
- In a positive and polite fashion, volunteer should assist participants with learning strokes and techniques
- Discuss or answer questions about local animals, ecosystems, and program topics
- Be alert to the weather, struggling participants, and other issues
- Communicate any problems or potential problems to the naturalist
- Be flexible to the needs of the group and naturalist
- Help participants with fitting their lifejackets

### **REQUIREMENTS & EXPECTATIONS**

- Prior kayak experience
- Successful completion of our kayak leader training every 3<sup>rd</sup> year
- Strong paddling and swimming skills
- Knowledge of paddling and water safety
- Ability to lead and speak to a small group
- Ability to gauge safety of situations and communicate instructions clearly
- Canoe/Kayak Volunteers are asked to commit to specific trip dates as they become available

#### **TRAININGS**

- Initial orientation in-person or virtual
- Scheduled trainings will be provided at Kings Landing Park. Training must be completed with the
  concurrence of naturalists before volunteer can assume a leadership role. Aspiring volunteers may
  shadow existing volunteers until training is complete
- Attend additional trainings and enrichment events as available
- · Volunteers will receive specific training on our trip logistics and equipment

### PROIECT DATES

Kayak trips are held in the fall (August-October) and spring (April-June). Frequency and topics of trips subject to change based on weather and availability of naturalists

## Summary of 2021 Activities

A kayak volunteer training was offered in May 2021 and 2 volunteers attended. We had very few public kayak trips this year due to staff turnover and lack of training. Trips we did have either used 2 staff or a staff and an intern vs relying on volunteers.

#### **Future Plans**

- Get volunteers to use Galaxy Digital to register for opportunities
- Meet with individuals volunteers as needed to help acquaint them with Galaxy Digital platform
- Assess the need to offer a kayak leader training in 2022 the naturalist staff went through ACA kayak training in spring 2021, and I will plan to work with them in spring 2022 to ensure that they are confident enough to lead trips.
